HEREAS a Definitive Treaty of Peace and Friendship between His Majesty and His Most Christian Majesty hath been concluded at Paris on the thirtieth day of May last; in conformity thereunto, We have thought fit, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, hereby to command, that the same be published throughout all
