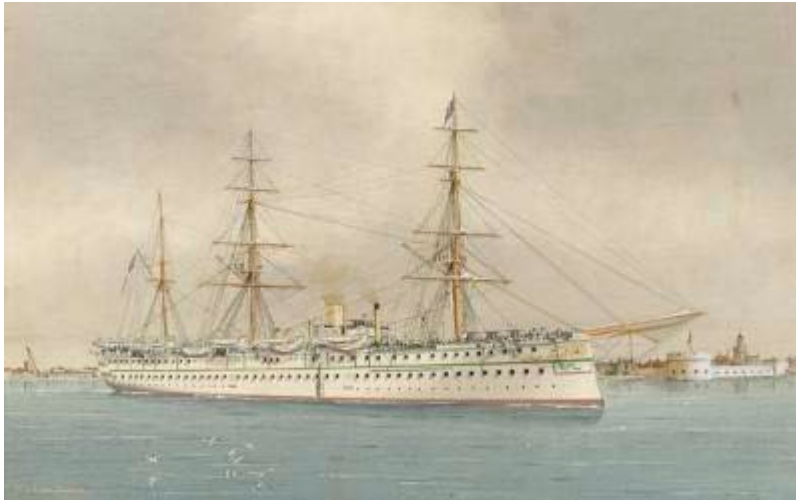

Description: The 6,210 ton 'Serapis' was launched on 26 September 1866 at the Thames Ironworks, Blackwall. She served as an Indian troopship and was the sister ship of HMS 'Malabar'. In September 1875 she transported the Prince of Wales to India where he represented Queen Victoria during the Durbar celebrating her appointment as Empress of India.
